

#### Year 6

## **Chameleon HQ**

Our children in Years 5, 6 and 7 have been taking part in lots of fun educational activities, including biscuit decorating and food creations which allowed us to put our maths and creative skills to the test! We measured how much icing sugar was needed for the biscuits and created a delicious treat. We also used our Maths skills to complete fun equations and problems, working together to figure out the answers.

Collaborating as a team, we constructed a fantastic Lego community which consisted of cars, houses and even building a school. For Science, the skittle experiment was suggested by one of our year 5 students, and we were not going to say no! We placed our Skittles in a pattern on a plate and then poured warm water over them until they were covered. In a few seconds, the experiment revealed the colours of the Skittles merging into the centre, creating block colours on the plate. Once the experiment had finished, the students swirled the colours together and called this lava water. After an hour, we checked the Skittles to see if their shells had dissolved. We saw that not only had the shells dissolved, but the whole skittle was gone! We didn't expect that!

Skittles are coated in food colouring and sugar. We learnt that when you pour water over the Skittles the coloured coating dissolves spreading through the water. The colour and sugar dissolve into the water and then diffuse through the water, making it the colour of the skittle.

Excitedly, we all built our own den, enabling us to create our own safe space in Ferndown Upper School. We were allowed to bring items from West Moors Middle School to Ferndown Upper School which helped to make the transition slightly easier. Bringing things with us means we are keeping West Moors Middle School in mind and are looking forward to our return.












# **Childcare Provision at Ferndown Upper School**

Our year 8s have been completing some incredible work during this extremely challenging time and they should be extremely proud of themselves.




One of our students has had a litter of puppies during lockdown and has spent her time caring for them as she studied!


We are so proud of every single child, every effort and achievement they make and we want the very best for them.



#### **Online Education Provision**

As a school, we were incredibly proud to share that we were the first school in the Ferndown cluster to provide children with a daily structured timetable with 'live' registration, virtual assemblies and 'live' lessons every day in core subjects. These 'live' lessons continue daily for all children in Years 5, 7 and 8 with my Year 6 team delivering face-to-face lessons in school. In addition, online 'live' tutorial support is provided daily in Maths by Mrs Ward to Year 6 children who are shielding or have chosen to continue their learning from home with all children encouraged to email their tutors/ teachers if they have any queries or need any additional support. We have also registered children on the 'Be Ready' virtual learning platform to access personal development and careers courses as well as additional curriculum resources. In the weeks ahead, teachers will be guiding our children to access important KS3 curriculum content via the Be Ready platform and we are in weekly contact with the website designers to support their continued progress and development.

As a team, we have been committed to building on our current online education provision to make it the best that it can be. We understand that there are children who have to share or have limited access to ICT resources and so we are continuing to provide curriculum packs for children in each Year group that can be collected from Reception. Presently, we are also trying to source funding for ICT equipment to loan and support families in need- we will notify parents/ carers if we have any positive news. In the meantime, we will continue to do all we can to support and facilitate our children's knowledge and development during these challenging times and are working on curriculum plans to support children's educational development between now and when school fully re-opens.

#### **LEARNING REVIEWS - SUMMER TERM**

We are pleased to inform you that we are planning to hold telephone learning review appointments for ALL children week commencing 6th July from 3.00pm - 4.30pm. These will be an opportunity to celebrate children's achievements this year, to identify ongoing targets and share awards. Although we have been apart from one another for some time, there is still much to celebrate and to look forward to. Please be aware that the dates and times that we are proposing are based on the current staffing levels around the children that we currently have in attendance at school. Should the Government change their advice on which year groups should be attending school before 6th July, we would need to review our plan to ensure that your child's teacher will still be available to call you. Therefore the booking system will not open until Monday 22nd June when we hope that there will be more clarity from the Government. Appointments should be made via email (office@westmoorsmid.dorset.sch.uk) and more details will follow. We also appreciate that you have spent a lot of time working alongside your child on the Home Learning Platforms and therefore we understand entirely if you feel you do not need a learning review appointment. In the meantime, please make a note of the dates in your diary. As always, if you have anything more pertinent that you wish to discuss, then please don't hesitate to get in touch.
