#### **Dear Parents/ Carers**

Well, we have started another fantastic year of learning and progress for our children at West Moors Middle School. We have been so impressed by how mature and independent the children are becoming, being responsible for their belongings in lockers; following their timetables; signing up for leadership roles; and being wonderful ambassadors for our school. To their credit, all of our new Year 5 pupils have settled in really well and are getting used to their new routines, as are all of the other new pupils who joined us this term. Welcome to you all! We start this newsletter by saying a huge thank you to the many parents and people in our village who continue to support our school family so well. Whether you come in to help, have donated resources and funding or have offered kind words of support, all that you do is really, really appreciated and valued.

Our vision is for all children to thrive in order to be the best they can be- together. This half term our assemblies have therefore focussed on respect, the importance of celebrating differences and being kind to others using both words and actions- our golden thread weaved through each year is that 'If you do not have something nice to say then do not say anything at all.' This extends to the use of social media and in assemblies we have reinforced the importance of internet safety and being aware of cyber-bullying with an emphasis on how to keep themselves safe. With some lovely weather we have been able to make the most of our grounds. This has meant that the children have been able to play sporting activities on the field during outdoor PE lessons and their lunch breaks for longer. However, in preparation for winter, we have been working with the School Council to collate children's ideas on what play equipment we could provide to further improve their break and lunch time experiences, in all weathers. Next half term, I will be asking whether any parents could volunteer their skills, time and/ or donated items to transform the pond and wooded area in the school's grounds- It is an extremely challenging time for all schools and in light of limited funding I hope that I can encourage a group of us to get together over a weekend in November and transform these areas so that we can provide our children with the best outdoor learning opportunities possible... we'll provide you with refreshments and bacon butties to keep us going!

This month, the Leadership Team have also been carrying out a range of monitoring activities. We have been scrutinising planning, looking at children's books, dipping in and out of a range of lessons as well as conferencing children. Our focus is on ensuring that the quality of teaching and learning throughout the school is increasingly consistent, with a greater emphasis on the teaching of higher order reading skills and deeper reasoning across the curriculum. Furthermore, next half term, I am delighted to share that our Link Governors will actively be involved in this process (02.12.19-.5.12.19), to support the monitoring of our education provision linked to the School Development Plan.

Every year we are grateful to everyone who makes our school a wonderful place to learn and grow, including the teachers, support staff, administrators, caretakers, cook, parents/ carers, governors and fabulous children who come to school every day and strive to do their best, look after each other, learn and grow before our very eyes. ### **Macmillan Coffee Morning**



#### Office Reminders

#### New times of the day from 5<sup>th</sup> November 2019

Following discussions with staff and a sample of children in each group, a trial of revised timings for lessons during the school day has been agreed for Autumn 2. This was in light of learning behaviours observed throughout the day (with children getting tired after lunch), to enable children to have a shorter afternoon with an assembly at the end of the day.

The staff team will ensure that no children will go without a snack and they will be encouraged to bring in a healthy snack for break time. A number of schools have adopted a similar timetable and this has been shown to have a positive effect on learning. However, children and staff will be involved in evaluating whether these changes have indeed helped their learning, comparing their timetable in Autumn 1 and Autumn 2. If the former is the preferred model then we will go back to that in Spring 1 but it is important for us to trial and evaluate initiatives in light of feedback. In addition, a further trial is being introduced in Spring 1, after Christmas, with a free breakfast club delivered between 08.00-08.40 for which we are seeking sponsorship from Tescos, Waitrose and Sainsburys.
